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Tampines gives TMCC pride of place among region's best

New layout offers a high-standard course, fabulous clubhouse and top-class facilities.

It was an eventful 2018 for Tanah Merah Country Club, marked by a dramatic switch of many programmes to the club's Tampines layout.

And rightly so.

For with more land to be lost at the Garden layout because of Government acquisition, the plan to place more emphasis at the Tampines side is a move in the right direction.

So in April last year, the new 18-hole championship Tampines course was opened; rather in a simple way as the clubhouse, buggy bay and parking areas were still in the process of being sorted out.

Limited flights were allowed initially as the course was new and in the process of being tested out, with emphasis placed on feedback so that many things could be ironed out.

And gradually as more and more members were allowed to play, the fine-tuning of the course was in process, leading to what today is a superb layout, ready to welcome the world's top professionals for competition.

It is a long course off the black tees, and even off the white tees it plays generally long with two par-fours nudging the 400-metre mark.

But the club's general committee agrees that the course still needs some fine-tuning, and is working on positive feedback and daily rides round the course to ensure that everything is in proper order, even where landscaping is concerned.

Now that the fabulous clubhouse is completed, and the buggy bay and parking areas are carefully seen to, many important events have been moved from the Garden site to Tampines.

No doubt, another reason for the move is that the Garden course is set for redevelopment from February. And there won't be any de-emphasis on the Garden course.

For the bigger reason is that the Tampines facilities have improved tremendously, and the clubhouse stands as a major model of sophistication.

Expansive and roomy, the banquet rooms are top-class, the terrace area is wide and open allowing free ventilation and the changing rooms are among the best seen in the top clubs of the region.

In light of this, the soft opening was done in September 2018, and major annual events such as the Combined Captains' Day, Golf Yuletide Challenge and the New Year's Eve countdown were held at Tampines for the first time in many years.

And, judging by feedback from the record turnouts, both events were a huge success, especially the 31 December grand function which greatly pleased the diners who responded by saying that this annual celebration should continue at Tampines.

However, the TMCC management is not one to just sit down and lap up the laurels. The general committee is willing to even manage to the minutest detail to ensure that the club's lofty standards are raised and that it remains among the best clubs in the region.

Without taking any credit from the always-reliable Garden which had so often put TMCC on the world golfing map, testament to that for the time being is a Tampines layout offering a fascinating course, luxurious facilities and a delectable food menu that can only make you keep coming back.

The Tampines Course will be officially opened on Saturday, 23 February, with a fund-raising event to raise money for three charities: MediaCorp Enable Fund, Down Syndrome Association, and Stroke Support Station. ESM Goh Chok Tong will be the guest-of-honour and Konica Minolta has generously come in as a main sponsor, donating \$100,000. Also stepping forward as a donor is BMW, who has come in as a platinum sponsor and hole-in-one sponsor as well.

New General Committee member Joey Chang, who has been made the Events & Marketing Convenor is leading the charge to make this event a highly successful one. And he is happy that he is getting all-round support from Who's Who at the club.

Kindly be advised that from Saturday, 16 February 2019, the reciprocal arrangement between the Club and Clearwater Bay Golf & Country Club (Hong Kong) shall be converted into an affiliate relationship.

Clearwater Bay GCC has informed us that due to the overwhelming usage by reciprocal club members from the region, and on consideration that their own members' demand on their 18-hole facility is very high, Clearwater Bay GCC had taken the decision to change all regional reciprocal arrangements to affiliate relationships.

As such, from Saturday, 16 February 2019, TMCC Members visiting Clearwater Bay GCC shall be required to pay their prevailing members' guest rate, which is currently HK\$950 + HK\$125 for golf buggy. TMCC Members' guests shall be required to pay the prevailing local visitor rate, which is currently HK\$1,900 and inclusive of golf buggy (weekdays except public holidays).

We will continue to review and secure reciprocal arrangements with other exclusive and great golf facilities in the region for members' enjoyment.



SGA-CHS SELF-POSTING OF SOCIAL GOLF SCORES

With effect from Friday, 1 March 2019, Members are required to self-post their Social Golf Games Scores online using the SGA-CHS Mobile App or via its website <https://chs.sga.org.sg/#/>. There will no longer be any club scorecard drop-off boxes. Members without online access may use the PC at the Golf Office to access their SGA-CHS account to key-in their scores.

For ease of using this online handicapping system, download the SGA CHS app onto your smart phone, that is available for both IOS and Android devices.

Using the SGA-CHS Online Handicapping System

1) Register in the SGA-CHS at <https://chs.sga.org.sg/#/> or mobile app.

You will receive acceptance of registration from the SGA-CHS email once your details have been verified by your home club.

2) Activate your SGA-CHS account.

After the SGA-CHS account is activated, you will be able to enjoy the convenience of accessing your handicap index records and post your scores anytime and anywhere.

Members who have already registered with the SGA-CHS without providing your email address, please be reminded to provide your email address to Golf Office.

Members who have provided their email address but have yet to activate their account, kindly be reminded to do so as soon as possible.

THE 20 MOST IMPORTANT CHANGES TO THE RULES OF GOLF 2019

- 1. Search time – Reduced from five minutes to three minutes.
- 2. Ball moved during search – Replace with no penalty.
- 3. Embedded ball – Free relief anywhere through the green.
- 4. Measuring a drop – Use longest club (except putter).
- 5. Dropping – Drop from knee height rather than from shoulder height.
- 6. Taking stance on the wrong green is no longer allowed.
- 7. Ball unintentionally hits player or equipment – No penalty.
- 8. Double hit – No penalty; now counts as only one shot.
- 9. Touching sand in bunker incidentally is permitted.
- 10. Loose impediments can be removed anywhere including hazards.
- 11. Dropping a Ball Out of Bunker – two penalty strokes.
- 12. Water hazards – Now called "Penalty Areas."
- 13. Touching ground in penalty area – No penalty.
- 14. Ball moves on green after being marked – Replace without penalty.
- 15. Ball accidentally moved on putting green – Replace without penalty.
- 16. All damage to green can now be repaired.
- 17. Positioning a club for alignment is not permitted.
- 18. Caddie assisting with alignment is now not permitted.
- 19. Putting with flag stick in the hole is now permitted.
- 20. Ball wedged against the flag stick and side of the hole is deemed as holed.

In the evening of day five, the party attended a gala dinner hosted by The Dunes at the Four Points by

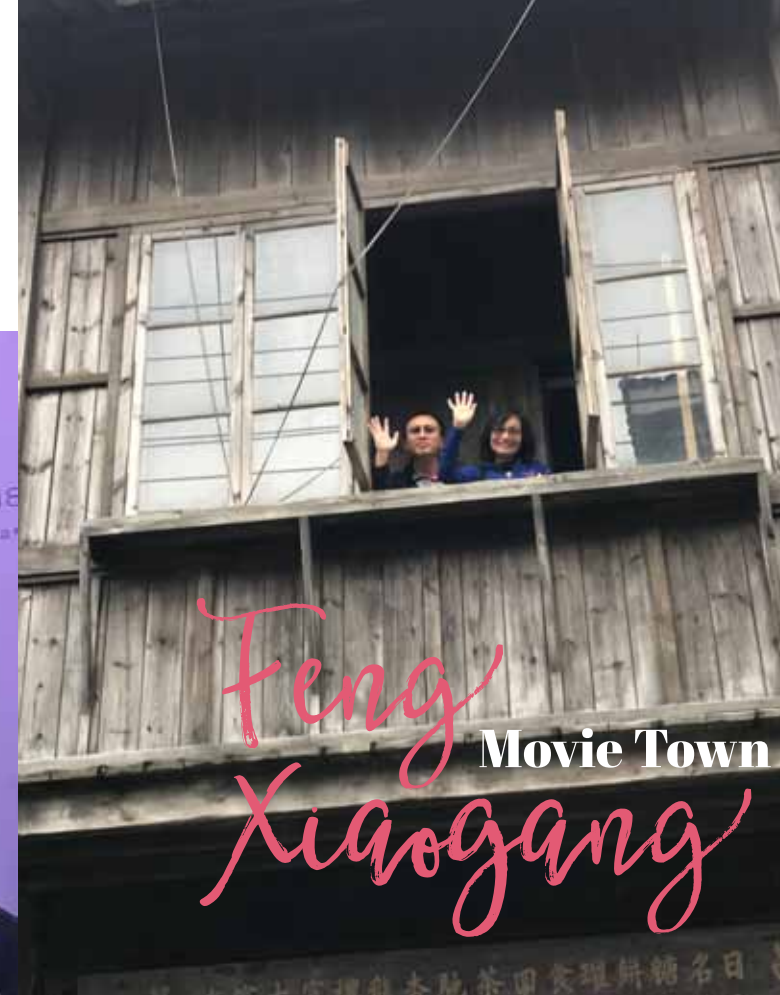

REPAIRING DIVOTS

Divot Introduction

Most good swings on well-struck iron shots produce a divot. The word "divot" refers to two different effects which relate to; 1) the top layer of turf that is sliced off as your iron enters the ground & 2) the resulting scar, or patch of bare earth, that is left in the fairway.

Repairing divots is an important duty of golfers who create them. According to the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America, a repaired divot can speed up the healing process (meaning: the grass will cover over the scar in the fairway) by 2 weeks, as opposed to an unrepaired divot which could still show the scarring many weeks afterwards.

To help us to help you to take care of the golf course there are sand funnels and a sand box container set up on the golf buggy and sand refill pots are located at most tee boxes. As well as sand funnel stations near to the 1st & 10th tees.



Golf buggy sand funnel & sand bucket options

Identify your Divot

The golfer's iron has sliced off the top layer of turfgrass, exposing the sod underneath. (This happens because irons are designed to strike the ball on a descending path)



Sand funnel stations near to 1st and 10th tees are there to help you refill your container or collect a funnel

How to repair your divot

Now that you've taken a divot, what's your correct course of action? There are two ways of repairing, or "fixing," divots. One is to fill the divot with sand the other is to retrieve the turfgrass/sod patch, that was sliced off after striking the ball, and place it back.



Take the container of sand and simply pour enough sand to fill the divot



Smooth over the sand pile with your golf shoe to level out the divot

Once you've filled the divot, use your foot to smooth over the sand so its level with the grass edges. There you go it's very easy to do and you're done! This practice will assist in healing the golf course and allow for fast recovery.

You may wish to replace your divot as another option. If you've taken a "clean divot," you'll find the turf still in one neat piece. Just fit the divot back into the ground the same way it came out (as you would a puzzle piece). If the divot is in multiple pieces you are best to use the sand funnel option.

When the turf is replaced tramp down with your shoe, cover in sand and you're done.

And finally, repairing divots is always a necessity and never to be compromised as we require our golf courses, with your support, to be in their best condition at all times.

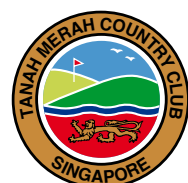

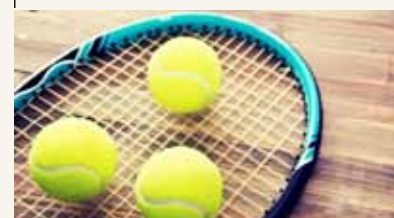

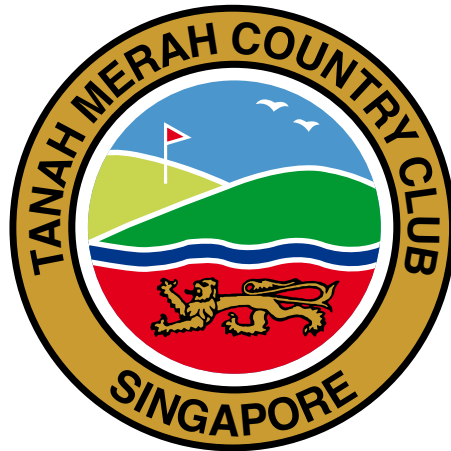
