TMCC working hard to have major event at Tampines in 2021 By Godfrey Robert

AGM attendees told that club is seeking sponsors to bring European Tour event

Thursday, 18 April 2019

he target is to stage an international event at the Tanah Merah Country Club's challenging Tampines course in 2021.

And the club management will do its utmost to secure a sponsor for an European Tour event at the redeveloped par-72 course.

So said Joey Chang, the convenor for events and marketing at the club, in reply to a question by member Peter Teo at the club's 36th Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 18 April 2019, attended by 45 people.

In the light of the Tampines course redevelopment with the plan to take over many major events from the Garden layout, currently undergoing redevelopment, Mr Teo's question was a valid one. And although Mr Chang's reply was brimming with sincere intention, the newly-appointed GC member, who has already been working hard to find sponsors, also stated that it won't be an easy task.

He said: "Securing a sponsor is not easy, and we have approached various sponsors. It is in the preliminary stages. To host an international event would require US\$10 million and sponsors."

"The building of hospitality suites would be no problem once we secure the sponsors and money. Garden course is still closed and we can target to host an event in 2021."

To Mr Teo's concern that Tampines greens are not suitable for professionals to play because they are too challenging, club president Ho Beng Huat said: "We are confident of our hardware, hospitality and facilities etc. It was the designer's intention to build a course that is not too challenging or too simple.

"Our Tampines course was built to host international events versus a club green."

To explain further, he added that the Garden course will have a different character from Tampines course, citing that a game of golf is about good or bad bounce, and not quitting or blaming your

caddie or course. It is about putting the ball next to the pin."

Member Oliver Hua asked why members were being turned away when the course is occupied by a corporate golf event. He added that such corporate events are held at the expense of the members and their benefits being revoked or compromised. He wanted to know the rights of members during such sponsored events.

Club president Ho replied that corporate events brought in revenue (as it is with all golf clubs) and this is done so that club's cash reserves are not touched unnecessarily.

He added that members are informed in advance of such events, which are not held on weekends.

Member CS Tan asked which committee member decides on the cancellation of social events at the club, especially when they are cancelled at the 11th hour. His feeling is that such events should be a service rendered to the club and not held to make profits.

President clarified that the club management is empowered to manage the day-to-day running of the club, adding that such events are already heavily subsidised.

Club general manager Kok Min Yee said that the Marketing Department usually organised these events and a minimum number of persons would be indicated in the future on marketing collaterals so as not to create a misunderstanding. The club also did not want cancellations and will usually try to prevent such incidences.

An assurance was given by Mr Chang that the situation is being reviewed, including that of communication channels, and sought members' patience as the management work towards improving the situation.

The smoking room at the Tampines clubhouse was a subject that concerned members Peter Teo and WP Leong who asked for its justification, benefits and cost.

President replied that as Tampines is equipped to cater to all types, including locals and foreigners, housing smokers in a room with a smoke extractor that would eliminate smoking at the clubhouse umbrella. He added that the cost was minimal and the pros outweighed the cons in this situation.

Member CS Tan agreed with the president and cited Sheshan Golf Club in China as having this facility and it was necessary if the club wanted to stage international events.

Member Peter Teo queried on the restrictions on allowing walking on the course and suggested that days with low utilisation to be set aside so as to not slow down the pace of play of other golfers.

mindful of the length of the Tampines course and to keep pace of play to within 4.5 hours, the course comes with a buggy.

He added that allowing walkers at all times will have a direct impact on the pace of play, and that Garden will be a walking course.

President Ho said that the needs of walkers had already been catered for at Tampines at certain timings, and that situation would be monitored.

Captain Lee Lian Hong replied that they were Also at the AGM, Mr Ho said that the club's financial operations were lower but there was a deficit of \$2.98 million last year, as had expected, because of the operations of just one

- 1. Sunday the 24th of February 2019 was the last day of operations at the Old Garden Course and to help celebrate there was a Memories of Garden Golf Tournament. 120 participants took part in an individual and team event along with fun novelties, such as inside the circle, longest drive with an oldstyle wooden head club and steel shaft. The green speed was over 10, much to delight of all players and there were no restrictions on golf buggies entering the course. The evening dinner and prize presentation was highlighted with Bingo, Memories of Old Garden Course review presentation, live music provided by TMCC staff, Q&A and a lucky draw to complete the evening. We thank all the members who took part and look forward to the re-opening of the New Garden in the first quarter of 2020.
- 2. The Garden Course is being redesigned by The Robert Trent Jones II Design Team and is an 11-month project covering 8 months of construction and 3 months for turf grow-in. The par of 71 course will be made up of five par 3's, 9 par 4's and 4 Par
- 3. Work on the New Garden Course commenced on Monday the 25th of February 2019. On the same day the Garden Driving Range was closed, and members were given the opportunity to practise at the Laguna Driving Range at Laguna National with members rate to apply until the Tampines Driving Range opens.
- 4. The golf course Shaper, Mr. Steve Page, arrived to site on 5th of April after working with the Robert Trent Jones Designers at a site in Mexico. He will be with us for 7 months and is the key personnel to help bring the design to life with features such as ribbon tees, full sand-faced rugged-edged bunkers, subtle green designs that will incorporate up to 8 pin positions on each green and fairways which fold into the landscaping to give your golf ball every chance to stay in play.

6. Latest updates

- All existing sand from fairways, tees, greens and roughs has been excavated and placed into piles in preparation for sand washing at old Hole 4, following which it is then further stockpiled at old Hole 5 in readiness for reuse.
- Plastic hoarding has been installed around the club house and sports complex, to protect from dust.
- All boundaries, tees, turning points and greens of the new Garden have been staked out.
- Greens 4, 5 & 9 have been shaped
- Hole 5 tee box, fairway bunkers, green side bunker earthworks are completed
- Robert Trent Jones designers will be visiting the site as and when required to meet with the Contractor, Site Manager, Management and Development Committee Members.
- Site irrigation pump house and complete irrigation system design is in process
- Revised waterfall design to be enlarged with an improved water flow visual effect, along with the lake, will be "in play" for holes 16 and 18
- Grasses selected for fairways, tees and roughs will be Zoysia Matrella from Thailand.
- Platinum Paspalum grass for the greens will be purchased direct from the USA and flown in to be planted directly for best results.

7. Landscaping

- Unwanted trees that cannot be transplanted have been removed.
- Trees designated for transplanting to other areas of the course has commenced.
- Existing Landscaping and shrubs has been removed and set aside for further propagating and replanting when needed.

George remains humble in victory

Former national golfer proves too strong for his Matchplay rivals

or a former national golfer, winning club titles may seem

■ titles may s passe.

But not for George Foo, 28, a passionate sportsman who battled between a pursuit for pro golf and a business career before settling on the latter.

Foo, like his rookie-pro younger brother Gregory, showed great promise as junior golfers with the national squad.

But while Gregory chose a golfing career, George followed in the footsteps of his businessman father Larry, who gave them both the best in golf. However Larry believed that both his sons should remain in golf as the game taught them good values.

So when George, a former winner, entered his name for the club's Matchplay competition, many – especially his opponents -- felt that he was a top contender for the title.

But George, a battle-hardened golfer, has never approached any tournament - big or small - with a different mindset.

For him, every match is important, and every opponent is a contender. And he appreciates their decision to make the entry list.

For the record, he beat Fang Jia Wei 5 and 4, Maximus Toh 4 and 3 and Samir Bedi 3 and 1, before outwitting Teo Han Kiat 5 and 4 in the final.

And for and every match, he produced his A game. The always-smiling George said: "It was important for me to stay focused on the process of playing my best golf throughout the entire championship, given the nature of matchplay and how momentum can swing either way, especially at the challenging Tampines course."

George added: "What went well for me throughout the event was that I was able to gain a slight edge after nine holes and kept the momentum going, especially in the semi and final. Precision from tee to green was absolutely pivotal."

He added that in the final he made two birdies on the front nine (par-three fourth hole and par-four ninth hole). "These birdies gave me the halfway advantage, and I managed to play steady regulation golf on the back nine."

On whether he prepared strongly for this event, he replied: "Leading up to the event, I was able to play a couple of weekend games, so it was nice to find a good rhythm."

For a former national golfer, good rhythm is key to complement all his other abilities to result in championship form.



V for Vicky and Victory

Petite 12.3-handicapper wins first club title with majestic Matchplay triumph

Ladies Matchplay Championship 10,16 & 17 March 2019

e went to Shanghai seeking a worthwhile investment in property. And he returned with something more than he had wished for. Dr Chong Tat Chong found a lifelong partner in petite Vicky Zan Jiao.

After a first meeting with the lovely couple at TMCC's Tampines lounge recently, I surmised that they are certainly made for each other. It was a meeting of minds 12 years ago, crossing land and sea over 3,800 kilometres, but the palpable and infectious deep affection I witnessed was as though they were good longtime next-door neighbours.

They joked, bantered, teased and complimented each other, but the best common denominator between them is their deep passion for golf, a game introduced to Vicky by her husband 10 years ago. Dr Chong, a single-handicapper who plays golf at least twice a week, has also been her longtime coach. But nowadays,

he only offers her tips as Vicky, a league player, has club coach Daren Lim for guidance and advice.

So who takes credit for her recent club Ladies' Matchplay triumph? Vicky's verdict: "My husband for showing me the ropes and encouraging me always. And Daren for his worthwhile tips." Dr Chong's dosage on that memorable triumph: "Vicky, for her natural talent and ability to learn fast".

In fact, as Vicky has said, it is a combination of both, and coach Daren's regular instructions have made Vicky, a 12.3-handicapper, play better than expected most of the time. In a smattering of English, punctuated with gestures, Vicky acknowledges her husband's take about her short-game strength.

"Yes, chipping and putting are my strong assets. They make up for my lack of distance," said the affable Vicky, who drives a modest 160 metres. Dr Chong, a semi-retiree who enjoys palliative work, chips in: "And she is a steady player, always finding the middle of the fairways. She can be a tough opponent". A tough opponent she was, as found out by her Matchplay rivals

She received a walkover from Goh Gaik Seoh in her first match, but Vicky rued that "victory", saying:

"I'd rather had played Seoh. I enjoy games". Her next opponent, the battle-hardened Fumiko Minowa, stretched Vicky all the way, as the battle was a ding-dong affair.

"I was one-up, after winning the tough par-four 17th. Then I told myself, I should avoid trouble and play a safe game on the last par-five hole. I played a steady bogey, after being four on. Fumiko had a long putt for bogey which I gave."

Next came friend and foe in the veteran Michelle Ang, a multi-crowned champion at the club. "I play with her often as we are league players. In fact, I learn a lot playing with Michelle, and I knew this was going to be a difficult game.

"Fortunately, I put the pieces together, and went twoup after the first nine. I lost the 10th, but I told myself that I should keep my composure. And my steady play, saw me clinch it at the par-three 16th which I parred to win 3 and 2."

It was a memorable March 17 triumph, as it was Vicky's first club victory. The majestic momentum continued as Vicky was spurred to win the A Division title a month later. The signs are that with her hard practice, good work ethic and consistency, we are going to see Vicky win more crowns.

The modest Vicky, who has travelled the region often with her husband and also played at some of the Scottish courses, the famed Carnoustie included, however, said: "Titles are good, but my philosophy is to enjoy the game, meet up with friends, savour the camaraderie, and enjoy the exercise." Well said, champion Vicky.



Since we notified members back in December 2018 of the implementation of Members selfuntil the full implementation of from 1st March 2019, more members have been approaching the Golf Office to learn about self-posting and using of the SGA-CHS App.

ENSURE YOUR GOLF HANDICAP IS VALID

The club is unable to issue / certify your golf handicap should your golf handicap account becomes inactive or invalid due to no score postings or excessive penalty scores posted.

Please keep your official golf handicap valid by ensuring your golf handicap account under SGA-CHS is active by posting scores after every round of golf (9 holes or 18 holes) and to post vour golf scores on time (within 13 days of playing).

If you do not post an acceptable score within 13 days of playing, CHS will post a "penalty score" equal to the lowest Handicap Differential in your scoring record on the 14th day.

PREVENTING DANGEROUS PLAY

Be careful when and where vou swing your clubs. A golfer must not play his shot until all players posting of social golfing score ahead are out of range. Never underestimate the potential distance of your shot, especially during windy conditions whether headwind or tailwind.

> For blind spots on the golf course, always take extra effort to ensure front group is clear and out of range. Never assume there are no golfers in front. If for some reason, you or your flightmates hit a wayward shot, you must immediate shout "FORE" to alert / point to the direction of the wavward ball.

You must go to the affected party and apologise unreservedly instead of trying to explain the reasons, making excuses or downplay the severity of the situation. Upon completion of vour round, vou may apologise again and a round of drink usually helps.

Members who encounter dangerous play situations should not approach / chide / shout at the other party. Please approach the Marshal or call the golf Office for Marshal assistance.

TAMPINES COURSE INTERIM POLICY ON **EVENING 9-HOLE WALKING AFTER PM TIME SHEET**

Since the closing of Garden in February 2019 there have been several appeals from regular walkers at Garden to allow walking also at Tampines. As members are aware Tampines

has always been designed and designated as a buggy-only course. The New Tampines is in fact even longer than the Old Tampines at 6,887 metres with some green to the next tee distances up to 150 metres. However, in view of the appeal by walkers the General Committee is agreeable to allow walking for evening 9-hole golf at Tampines as an interim accommodation to walkers until the reopening of the Garden course in early 2020.



- Mandatory for all golfers to use a sand funnel provided at or near the tee boxes. Please return them to the stations at the end of play
- · When the lightning warning siren has been activated, please stop play immediately and head to the nearest shelter located at the 4th tee/ 5th fairway, 7th green or 12th fairway /13th fairway
- No trolleys are to be stored at the Tampines Clubhouse except in golf bag lockers rented by members
- Fishing for golf balls at lake edges is not permitted

Pace of play readings will be taken and all evening golfers are encouraged to allow faster flights to play through.






Wendy also joined in the trip to four Golf Shinwa courses.



His older brother Dylan, 13, also impressed by winning all his games and dropping just one set against Brandon Foo, 12.






