Tampines range to be opened soon, slew of activities and initiatives should keep Members busy and occupied

The Driving Range is an essential part of any golf club.

This is where the pre-event action is mainly centred during a major championship.

And this is where the professional golfers spend much of their time in between events in addition to taking in fitness building, gym work and putting practice.

Some golfers, like former world No. 1 Vijay Singh, of Fiji, have been known to spend hours on hours hitting balls, sometimes up to 1,000 balls a day before and during a major event.

I saw that with Vijay during the Volvo Open in Valderrama, Spain, about 20 years ago, and the likes of him would prefer no distraction, not even a few minutes spared for the media.

Funnily enough, there was once when I stood on the next bay with American Major winner Phil Mickelson at the driving range of the Old Course at St Andrews, Scotland.

Mind you, he was so focused that I could not even get a word through to him, and after two hours I gave up, more out of embarrassment than having the patience to wait for he was hitting to distances with his seven-iron where I reached with my three-wood.

For amateur and social golfers, the driving range is also a “must-visit” to hone your game so that when you are on course it could make the difference between a par and double-bogey after finding trouble.

In that light, it was heartening to hear that Tanah Merah Country Club Driving Range, now located at the Tampines course, is slated to be opened soon.

No doubt, there has been a delay as the approval from the various government agencies has yet to be obtained.

The Club management has kept the members informed with a notice, which also said: “Our consultant is working very closely with these government agencies to expedite the required approvals. We hope to open the new driving range before the end of July 2019.”

The former range beside the Garden layout was one of the best in Singapore with ample bays, good yardages within comfortable surroundings.

That being the standard set, it is no doubt that the new Tampines range will be up to par with what was at Garden, if not better.

Members who have been eagerly waiting for the range to be opened will be pleased with the news.

A word of caution though. There are some set rules within any driving range, so it will be to everyone's good that users of the range stick with the rules.

The Club's focus on being informative and inclusive, has said that it would be sending regular updates on the new range as well as the new Garden course which is currently undergoing redevelopment.

The Club will also be taking on some new initiatives for the benefit of all its Members, beginning with its Holistic Care programme, laced with an array of activities such as Jewellery DIY clinics, Oysters and Whiskey pairing, Pain Aromatherapy workshops and much more.

Also being laid out are Cooking and Baking workshops, which will include Gourmet sessions, Lifestyle Clinics and Wellness programmes.

In ageing Singapore, it is also timely that the Club will celebrate “Golden Oldies” during the next Social Dancing Night on July 27.

This event seems to be very popular, judging by the overwhelming response, so it would be wise not to be left out.

Members with children can look forward to the Kid's Carnival on August 4.

Family Day has been fixed on September 15, and the coupons will be on sale starting in July/August.

Members should enjoy more good news. Members looking to host large gatherings can also optimise on the restaurant's Weekday Set Menu promotion which offers a specially-crafted menu of savoury delights at only \$480 per table.

To enjoy the promotion, Members are advised to make reservations in advance and the Club will toss in a complimentary bottle of red wine to toast to their special occasion.

THE OPENING OF TAMPINES DRIVING RANGE

The new Tampines Driving Range will be opening soon once approval from the various Government Agencies is granted. The range is situated to the left-hand side of the Tampines Golf Course as you enter the club.

Members may choose to park their vehicles directly at the range with 16 reserved spaces available and a further parking area adjacent to the facility. Golfers may prefer to walk from the Clubhouse. There will be 20 undercover hitting bays with ceiling fans and 8 outdoor driving range bays.

To help sharpen up the short game, there is a chipping and putting green simulated to course conditions. The range is a lengthy 290 metres with range target greens situated from 50 metres up to 250 metres away. To help better understand how far you are hitting the ball, we have installed centre line coloured poles with the distances measured from each hitting bay.

The range facility also includes a 20-seater training Room to cater for rules and etiquette sessions, junior coaching programmes, seminars, corporate golf events and golf equipment launches.





Treasurer Golf will be setting up a Club Fitting and Golf Club Repairs Room to further assist members needs.

Range ball buckets are in 3 sizes - 25, 50 and 100.

Golf lessons will be available through Transview Golf Professionals, covering junior coaching, private and packages for groups to help you improve at your own pace and standards.

Operating hours:

Mondays : Opening from 11.30am and last balls 8.00pm
Lights out at 8.30pm

Tuesdays to Sundays : Opening from 7.00am and last balls 8.00pm
Lights out at 8.30pm

Course Maintenance Closure: Mondays till 11.30am

If Monday is a Public Holiday, maintenance closure will fall on Tuesday.



Golf buggies will not be permitted to enter the driving range areas.

We look forward to announcing the opening of the Range very shortly.

GARDEN COURSE REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT

A site visit by Mike Gorman and Bruce Charlton, the Garden Course Designers for Robert Trent Jones, took place from May 25 to the 27, 2019 to review the shaping and construction. Adjustments were made to accommodate and support further safety measures at holes 8, 11, 12, 17 and 18.



Green @ hole 11

The Garden Course is being redesigned by The Robert Trent Jones II Design Team and is an 11-month project covering 8 months of construction and 3 months for turf grow-in. The Par 71 course will measure up to 5,800 metres from the back-tee markers and comprise of five par 3's, nine par 4's and four Par 5's.

The waterfall design has been revised so as to enlarge the waterfall and with the lake in play for Holes 16 and 18.

Grasses selected for fairways, tees and roughs will be Zoysia Matrella from Thailand. Platinum Paspalum grass for the greens will be purchased direct from a USA farm and flown in to ensure the turf is in the best condition when planted on our course.

To make sure of purity, the turf farms have been thoroughly inspected and tested against weed and other grass type contamination.



11th Hole Tee Box

This Project is set out in four phases;

Phase 1A

Holes: 4, 5, 9 & 11

Construction Period: 25th February - 24th August 2019

Phase 1B

Grow-in: 11th May - 24th November 2019

Phase 2A

Holes: 6, 7, 8, 10, 12 & 18

Construction Period: 16th March - 24th September 2019

Phase 2B

Grow-in: 8th June - 24th December 2019

Phase 3A

Holes: 1, 15, 16 & 17

Construction Period: 22nd April - 24th October 2019

Phase 3B

Grow-in: 4th July 2019 - 24th January 2020

Phase 4A

Holes: 2, 14, 13 & 3

Construction Period: 28th May - 24th October 2019

Phase 4B

Grow-in: 14th September 2019 - 24th January 2020



9th Hole Tee Box

Latest updates

Phase 1 grassing has commenced with Hole 5 tee, fairway and rough and this will be followed by Holes 9, 4 and 11. Buggy paths for Holes 5, 6 and 9 have been completed while Hole 4 and 11 are under construction.

Club house buggy staging areas have been marked out which will cover the existing patio green and extend further out along the existing pathways from the golf pro shop. Further extensions will be provided nearer to the starter hut and to the side of the Golfers' Terrace.

Newly constructed lakes for Holes 4, 9 and 11 have been completed while those for Holes 6, 7 and 8 are progressing well.

Additional practice putting greens will be constructed to the left and behind tee box 16 and behind the 18th green near to the 10th tee.

The lake in front of the koi pond will be filled and shall make up part of the new practice putting green and pathway to and from the 10th tee.

The existing water pump station is still in use and will only close once the newly constructed pump station is completed and operationally ready.

Hole by hole information

Earthworks between Holes 6, 8, 9 and 10 have been completed and the areas are being planted with trees.

Hole 6 (PAR 4) – Buggy path at Tee is completed. Storm drainage on fairway and reshaping of the Green is completed. Lake rubble walls are in progress and irrigation mainline along the tee have been installed.

Hole 7 (PAR 3) – Tee and fairway rough shaping is in progress and nearing completion. Final shaping for the green is in progress and shall be completed next week. Adjacent lake wall is completed and rubble wall in progress.

Hole 8 (PAR 4) – Tee and fairway rough shaping is in progress along with greenside bunkers' dura-bunker, product for bunker face, is being installed. Fairway bunker works is next in line. Reshaping of the green has been completed.

Hole 10 (PAR 4) – Tee, fairway and bunkers are being shaped and green earthworks in progress.

Hole 12 (PAR 4) – Tee awaiting design and finalisation. Fairway and bunker earthworks in progress with green shaping is awaiting.

Hole 16 (PAR 4) – Tee, fairway and bunker earthworks in progress. Green awaiting design. Lake wall in progress.

Hole 17 (PAR 3) – Tee and fairway earth works are near completion. Green design will incorporate a bunker carry and rough shaping with bunker earthworks in progress.

Hole 18 (PAR 5) – Tee design will have some minor adjustments. Fairway, bunkers and green earthworks in progress. Lake earthworks in progress.

Landscaping

Featured landscaping such as sea hibiscus has been used to shield off fencing along and behind Hole 5 and the par5 Hole 9.

One of the featured huge Kaya trees, which was taken the right side of the old Hole 17, has been pollarded and transplanted between new holes 9 and 10. Recovery is in process with new leaves and branches forming.

A temporary tree nursery has been set up to the left of the new Hole 4. Landscaping and shrubs have been removed and set aside for further propagating and replanting when needed.

TAMPINES LAKES

Dangers of entering Lakes

The new lakes at the Tampines Course have been increased in size and designed to be self-sustaining and support the irrigation requirements needed to maintain the high-quality turf grass standards all year round.

When water levels recede the more enticing it is for golfers to enter the lake edges looking for golf balls.

The makeup of the Tampines lakes incorporates a 3 in 1 slope (30 degree) down to a rock wall then onto a cement ledge within the hazard stakes. You will also find bollards, landscaping shrubs and grasses, which help blend in the slopes and help to deter golfers from entering.

Water depth can vary from 4 metres down to 2 metres, depending on rainfall, weather and water intake amounts.

The main danger of entering lake boundaries lies within the rocky slopes down to the 30% cement ledges in search of golf balls.

Management strongly advises all golfers to stay well away from these areas. Searching for golf balls is a futile practice and dangerous undertaking that could result in an unnecessary incident.



It was déjà vu for Tanah Merah Country Club at this year's popular Rolex Golf Challenge inter-club series at the Singapore Island Country Club.

Having won the event before, it may seem as though it was par for the course for the foursome from TMCC.

But it was no so easy. For the other clubs put a major challenge this time.

Therefore to emerge winners was a big feather in the cap for the club.

Especially for the four players, Samir Bedi (handicap index 3.4), Jeffrey Tan (10.1), Elvin Sng 18.2 and Sarah Tan Wei (1.0); who combined effectively to be clear winners.

In fact, the Texas Scramble format suited the foursome very well, and they took to the challenge with a team handicap of 2.75.

With each player needing to contribute three drives over the 18 holes, it was also ideal to have a lady in the team for they played off the red tees at SICC's Bukit course.

The Rolex Challenge (for clubs and invited individuals) is a significant event for local golfers as it was previously the Rolex Open, an event that attracted top professionals from the region and beyond.

And every year, it is oversubscribed, but the efficient organisers, Rolex, go out of the way to accommodate the clubs, and its clients, customers, friends and the media in what is arguably the most fun golf tournament in Singapore.

Of course, the highest point is the lucky draw section (with a host of prizes). Near the end of the sumptuous sit-down dinner there is big excitement because the top prize is a Rolex Oyster Perpetual Submariner watch.

TMCC's four players were in great form as they tamed the Bukit championship course with skill and especially tactic, which was needed because you had to decide whose drive to pick and who should putt first (as there were four chances in the Scramble format).

Finishing runner-up were Laguna National Golf and Country Club while defending champions Warren Golf and Country Club finished third.

Mr Christian Gisi, the Rolex CEO, gave away the trophy to the TMCC team, which is displayed at the club's trophy cabinet.



SAMIR'S A TOP AMATEUR WITH A PRO APPROACH TO GOLF

He enjoys playing with strong amateurs, revels at beating the leading professionals

He stands out on any golf course.

Tall (1.88 metres in height), slim and well-attired, Samir Bedi is not your everyday golfer, but an outstanding amateur with a professional approach to the game.

And the 41-year-old partner at Ernst & Young, a multinational professional services firm headquartered in London, also provides some originality in replies to questions unlike the usual stock answers.

For instance, when asked what his biggest win in golf has been in his three decades of indulgence in the game, he replied: "Beating the pros."

Sensing that I was a little puzzled, he explained: "You see, I get to play with top Indian professionals like SSP Chawrasia, Rahil Gangjee and Arjun Atwal whenever I go to India for holidays."

"There is a lot of banter and verbal duels before and during the games, and I take extreme pleasure in my occasional victories over them in the social games."

It seems far-fetched that Samir can put some over the leading Asian Tour and PGA stalwarts, but when you consider that he is a very strong 2.1 handicap index golfer for whom the game is a family tradition (dad, uncles and relatives all play), you understand why he can turn it on when needed on the courses.

Born in Calcutta in India, Samir came over to Singapore in 2004 and enjoys his passion at competitions and friendlies mostly at Tanah Merah Country Club and Warren Golf and Country Club during the weekends.

Occasionally the Singaporean slots in an extra game a week, mostly at corporate events like the recent Rolex Inter-Club Challenge where he captained Tanah Merah to the title at SICC's Bukit championship course.

Rolex seems to have a special appeal for Samir who has always done well. Last year when he played for Warren, the Choa Chu Kang club sealed the title with his massive contribution.

He explained: "Rolex is a great event. In the Texas Scramble format, you must go in with a plan because there are a set of rules. My approach is three-fold: do not play safe, go for everything and with four chances in putting you cannot miss out on the makeable putts and go for the long ones as well."

"Mind you, we won because we made six birdies on the last seven holes, for the winning 12-under score."

Obviously the family pull saw Samir take up the game at the Royal Calcutta Golf Club (the second oldest golf club in the world after St Andrews in Scotland) as an early teenager. And he has never looked back since with a series of great performances over the years in Singapore and the region.



A few years back, the steady and consistent golfer who has had two holes-in-one, also qualified for the World Amateur Golfers Championships after a strenuous qualification run-up that saw him impress the organisers.

His recent best score was a four-under-68 showing at Tanah Merah's tough Tampines course during the club's monthly medal which he won against a slew of top amateurs.

But his lowest-ever score was a seven-under 65 in pro-am tournament in Calcutta which dumbfounded many pros and even the organisers.


However, Samir is not one to wallow in his fabulous scores for he modestly adds: "I know I do not have fundamental weaknesses, and golf is about muscle memory and mental strength. Of course how you play depends, on the day, and your feel for the day."

On who his favourite golfer is, Samir said: "Those around my age would not go for anyone else but Tiger Woods. He is a phenomenal golfer, a crusader who made the game so much more attractive and drew many youngsters to play the game."

"I hope Tiger does well at the coming British Open, and go on to beat Jack Nicklaus' record of 18 Majors."

At already 42, Woods may find this a tall order. But when Samir talks golf, it's good that you listen.





**Children's Sports Camp
Monday, 24 to Wednesday 26 June 2019**

The "Rugged Society" was a concept introduced to Singapore by our former Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Defence Dr Goh Keng Swee in the late Seventies.

And the sport of rugby, which someone once described as a "thug's game played by gentlemen" benefited most when Dr Goh placed much emphasis on the sport for schoolchildren, both primary and secondary.

The TMCC sports camp takes a cue from that model where it provides a platform for a holistic experience for the club's very enthusiastic campers in the form of multiple sporting disciplines and various activities intended to challenge as well as provide them with an unconventional outdoor learning experience.

And what the children learn are values such as honour, resilience, respect and teamwork which are utilised as building blocks for sporting success.

The first activity was a golf clinic at the Tampines course conducted by the bubbly coach Daren Lim. Tan wowed the kids with his drills and the excited children were later treated to a meal of fish and chips at the Tampines Golfers' Lounge.

The kids then had swimming and pool games which was followed by an exhilarating session on tae-kwon-do. The children thoroughly enjoyed the martial arts session where the breaking of boards drew curious looks from the people around.





A lot was accomplished on the second day, for after a hearty breakfast the campers set off for their first adventure at the SuperPark Singapore where they underwent a unique experience of joyful play at the numerous stations.

The 40,000 square-foot area had plenty of sports activities and fun obstacles including an augmented climbing wall, trampoline platforms, foam pits and skating areas as well as pedal car tracks that challenged the kids.

The exhilarating Duck Tours preceded the extraordinary ArtScience Museum visit where campers explored every exhibit with the meticulous streaks of scientists in the mould of Einstein and Stephen Hawking.

Visit to The Singapore Flyer was next from where the kids enjoyed the superlative spectacle of the Singapore skyline at night.

The last day of the camp saw the kids “getting their skates on” in the ice skating experience at the first and only Olympic-sized rink in the island.

The campers performed admirably as they gradually overcame the initial slips and falls while battling also the cold temperatures.

Then after a quick meal the group watched the highly-anticipated “Toy Story 4” at the movie theatre after which it was a bus ride back to the club.

And before dismissal, it was prize presentation (based on a points system with values as guiding principles) and Dean Singh of the Sports Department did the honours.

At the TMCC Poolside Café area on Sunday, May 5, 15 young swimmers were not just introduced to art through an impromptu arts programme.


All this just to bring out the creative spark in the keen and enthusiastic kids. It was an early start for the excited kids as they were between the ages of four and 12.


