

he layout is different, terrain is dissimilar, the landscaping has changed and even the par for the course has changed from 72 to 70 and now 71. But the most important

factor, the name, is further cast in stone. For one simple reason: The Garden is all too familiar, here and abroad. It is rich in history, filled with heritage, stuffed with favourite stories, and has been a playground for the world's best golfers, both male and female, and the fun-loving social players.

So over the years, we have seen the likes of former world No. 1s, Vijay Singh and Ernie Els, and Major winners Ian Woosnam, Sergio Garcia and Padraig Harrington. On the women's side, it the best bonus for the members, and certainly has welcomed the legendary Annika Sorenstam, Lorena Ochoa, Pak Se Ri and Grace Park, and leading ladies Karrie Webb, Inbee Park, Michelle Wie, Shin Ji Yai and Angela Stanford.

Now the refurbished Garden - for the third time - is ready to display its splendour after 11 months of inactivity which triggered a deep sense of expectation and anticipation. Since its opening on Feb 9, many members were privileged to luxuriate on the Garden and the verdict is that it The Tanah Merah Country Club management is an enjoyable course to play on.

No doubt, it is relatively short when compared to the first edition which staged some of the biggest events on the world's golfing calendar. But what famous American course designer Robert Trent Jones Jr has done is to utilise every bit of the reduced land area (because of Changi Airport's expansion plans) into usefulness and unravel a course that lives up to its original name.

Best of all, the Garden is the best complement to its "brother", the redeveloped Tampines course which can be a difficult layout for the high-handicappers and senior members.

So while the "championship" Tampines is in the best shape to parade some of the biggest names in men's golf with leading tournaments. the Garden is the best choice for major women's events. And it is not that you cannot alternate one for the other, because the Garden too can be a tricky option with some "hazards" that can inflate your score.

The reaction from most members who have played on the new Garden course has been very positive, with many expressing the desire to continue returning to the "playground". And guests, is the relief that with two courses, bookings are made easier and this grants better access to the "Tanah Merah twins".

An additional "hong bao" is the Garden Golfers' Terrace that has also been renovated. The new look offers better ambience and a refreshed advent that can be very inviting to the players and guests.

deserve the kudos for a "job well done", also because they bothered to sieve through members' feedback regularly while the Garden was undergoing the redevelopment.

The legendary Arnold Palmer, the pivot of "The Big Three" that included Jack Nicklaus and Gary Player once said: "I try to design golf courses that are individual in character and individual in their own standing."

The Garden is that and more. Enjoy your rounds.

It was the third redevelopment of the Garden layout, from par-72 to par-70 and now par-71.



Though more land was lost due to Changi Airport's expansion, the new Garden still has a decent 5,706 metres length as a par-71. There are four par-fives, nine par-fours and five par-threes, and while the layout looks manageable, it can also be tricky.


Hole 1 is a long par-four over 384 metres from the whites and while visually it looks playable, you still need accurate shots. There is also a par-three with an island green that struggles to hold your shots as water waits all round.

The course was efficiently designed by Robert Trent Jones II, who had a bold vision of the Garden Course, which while relatively short it still provides major enjoyment and entertainment as evidenced by the players. The grand waterfall feature brings life into the course while beautiful hues of emerald-green and cobalt-blue treat the eyes to a breath-taking view.










The slow burns of real satisfaction can be felt as the course requires careful planning and negotiation such as using the ground contours to roll shots onto a peninsula shaped green at Hole 9 parfive.

HOLLOW TINING

n February 17, TMCC had its regularly scheduled hollow tining at Tampines Course. This important maintenance includes an aerification process that creates more air space in the soil and promotes deeper rooting which ultimately keeps our grass plants healthy! Traffic from golfers' feet tend to compact the soil under the putting green. The aerification process aims to relive soil compaction, improve soil mixture around the highest part of a green's roots and reduce the accumulation of excess thatch, and ensuring the healthy roots get enough oxygen through the tiny pockets of air.

In most cases, aerification is done by removing half-inch cores from the compacted soil in order to allow the infusion of air and water thus encouraging growth. The spaces are filled with sand topdressing that aims to help the soil retain air space and thus aid the roots in growing downward.

Filling aerification holes with sand improves drainage and resists compaction. The periodic introduction of sand to a green's top layer can, over time, avoid or postpone expensive rebuilding or renovation of greens.

Growing of turf adds to a layer of organic matter on the surface. This layer, called thatch, is an accumulation of dead stems, leaves and roots. A little organic matter makes for a resilient green, but too much invites diseases and insects. Topdressing with sand can prevent thatch buildup and aerification is one of the best ways to reduce an existing layer and prevent an excess of thatch from becoming established.

The next time you are on our greens, feel the weight of the field underneath your soles and appreciate the maintenance work that goes into keeping our greens healthy!



We have created something new at Garden Course called "RIBBON TEES". Instead of separate tees, think of a wrapped Christmas present that's tied by a long wide ribbon.

The tees are long, with little folds and irregularities as they run along seamlessly, connected to the fairways.

The tees are integrated against the surrounding landscapes, but they are at different lengths and angles and flow through different grades as you go from tips to the forwards and the various markers ub between. They are a cross between a free-form tee and walking path.

Experts of the game have given compliments to Roberts Trent Jones II on his Ribbon Tee creations that were a feature of his 2015 US Open course at Chambers Bay. They were noted as the first creatively new idea of the original 21st century. It's "into" the land and "of" the land - eminently natural - and it doesn't feel like a tee "box", and you have many options for the markers. They may, however, be canted, so watch out. Find the place within the markers where it's flat or where you can use the grade to help shape your shot. We want you to try it!


